Ilian joined the INSEAD economics faculty in 1996. Until 2002 he taught in Fontainebleau and since 2002 he has been based in Singapore. Ilian holds a PhD degree from Princeton University and a B.S. from the Moore School of Business at the University of South Carolina. He teaches macroeconomics and econometrics at INSEAD. He has taught in the MBA, EMBA, PhD and many executive education programs as well as at the Global Leadership Fellows Program of the World Economic Forum. His areas of expertise include business cycles, monetary and fiscal policy, economic growth, financial crises and exchange rate determination. For his teaching Ilian has been nominated several times as one of the best teachers in the MBA and EMBA programs and he has won the Outstanding Teacher Award in 2006, 2008 and 2009.

As the Deputy Dean for Faculty and Research, Ilian is responsible for the recruitment and development of the faculty on school's campuses in Fontainebleau, Singapore and Abu Dhabi. He also oversees the PhD programme and chairs the R&D committee of INSEAD.

Ilian's research is on topics related to monetary policy, fiscal policy and economic growth. His papers have appeared in many academic journals such as *American Economic Review*, *Quarterly Journal of Economics*, *Journal of International Economics*, *Journal of Money, Credit and Banking*, etc. He has given interviews for BBC, CNBC Asia, Agence France Press, Dow Jones Newswire and others. Ilian is a regular keynote speaker, lecturer or panellist at events organized by the WEF, KPMG, Hewlett-Packard, Bloomberg, PwC, Swiss Re, Alstom, Deutsche Bank, BNP Paribas and other companies.

Ilian is also a research fellow at the Center for Economic Policy Research (London, UK). He was a member of the Scientific Committee of the Banque de France's Research Foundation (2002-2010) and of the Advisory Board of the Bulgarian National Bank. Currently he is a member of the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council on Fiscal Crises. In 2006 he was awarded the Distinguished Young Alumnus award by the Moore School of Business at the University of South Carolina.
